Keep OPEN 10 Youth Clubs and LESS grants to groups e.g.














WHAT WE HAVE CONSIDERED ...

Keep OPEN 14 Youth Clubs and NO grants to groups e.g.














BUT IF WE DO THIS, YOUNG PEOPLE HAVE SAID ...

The club is too far - it costs too much to travel!

I worry that less grants will mean less activities!

I'm too old to go to a club!

I prefer taking part in activities!

I want to talk to a Youth Worker whenever I need not just in a youth club!



BUT IF WE DO THIS, THE EQUALITIES IMPACT ASSESSMENT AND OPTIONS ASSESSMENT HAVE IDENTIFIED ...

A larger number of young people will not be able to access the service - we would only be present in SOME communities!, and travelling to us would be difficult

We won't be meeting Welsh Governments expectations -Youth Work Strategy, or the Youth Engagement Framework

Recruting and training staff will continue to be a challenge!




