PROCEDURES FOR LICENSING VARIATION HEARINGS

1. A written report will be presented by the Licensing Section (with recommendation).
2. Members of the Sub-committee may ask questions of the Council's representative.
3. At the Chairman's discretion the applicant and/or his representative may ask questions of the Council's representative.
4. The applicant and/or his representative may expand upon the application and call witnesses
5. Members of the Sub-committee may ask questions of the applicant and/or his representative
6. There will be an invitation for each consultee to support any written observations
7. Members of the Sub-committee may ask questions of the consultees.
8. At the Chairman's discretion the Council's representative and the applicant or his representative may summarise their case.

All are reminded of the four principles of the Licensing Act 2003 to be considered in all deliberations, namely:

- 1) Crime and Disorder Prevention;**
- 2) Public Safety;**
- 3) Public Nuisance Prevention; and**
- 4) Protection of Children from Harm.**

APPLICATION

An application to vary the premises of McDonald's Restaurants, Britannia Shopping Centre, Caernarfon Road, Bangor by PGL Enterprises Limited, 100 High Street, Mold, Flintshire is appended. The application is submitted on behalf of the applicant by the Shoosmiths company, who are acting as solicitors and as an authorised agency on behalf of the applicant. The application is submitted for an extension of the hours of standard licensable activities of providing late night refreshments to be consumed on and off the premises.

On the proposed operating schedule, the applicant details the intended steps to promote the licensing objectives, which include

- Operate a CCTV system
- Shift managers receiving training regarding safety and protection
- Comply with regulatory requirements in terms of fire safety, health and safety and food safety
- All staff to receive comprehensive safety training
- A no carrying open containers of alcohol policy
- Emergency contact points for staff
- Rubbish patrol outside the restaurant
- Noise control measures in place – self-closing doors, customers being encouraged to leave quietly.

See full details in the application form regarding the steps the applicant intends to take to ensure compliance with the licensing objectives.

A SUMMARY OF THE REPRESENTATIONS RECEIVED

Bangor City Council

An e-mail was received from the Council's Clerk objecting to the application based on the licensing objective of preventing crime and disorder and public nuisance. It was noted that the proposed hours would lead to an increase in the noise that customers make late at night, impairing on neighbouring residents. Concerns were expressed that an extension to the hours would lead to an increase in rubbish on the Street.

Local resident

A letter was received objecting to application the based on the licensing objective of preventing public nuisance, and concerns regarding anti-social behaviour. The resident noted that they were already being affected by the noise of loud music, and car noises relating to the licensable activities of the premises.
