## 1 Background

During the Annual Scrutiny Workshops held in June and July 2012, a number of matters were raised by councillors who had recently been involved in the Council's elections in May.

During their canvassing work their constituents had raised a number of issues that needed to be addressed by the Council. Although these matters were differed in detail, they had a central theme.

Here are some of the main issues raised: insufficient or inappropriate travel, cost of fuel for travelling and heating, lack of suitable local housing, lack of jobs, inconvenient and remote public and private services, social deprivation.

Some consideration has been given to some aspects already through the Housing Scrutiny Inquiry and matters considered by the Communities Scrutiny Committee on Housing and Public Transport; scrutiny of the Education Strategy and provision of care in the Services Scrutiny Committee and the work on the Sustainable Procurement Policy by this Committee.

However, the members of the Corporate Scrutiny Committee felt that there was a need to look in more detail on all of these elements to ascertain whether or not there was a general theme in terms of the effect on the inhabitants of Gwynedd and what the Council was doing to deal with it. Comments were made by the three Area Committees, and at the Corporate Scrutiny Committee on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2013, six members were appointed to further scope the work with officers and to submit a draft Brief to the Committee today.
