Concise judgement on the main strengths of learners' achievement Grade: 1

Children are able to confidently express a view. They possess a thorough grasp of the subject and can apply it to everyday life. Pupils make extensive use of ITC in their work, and experiences and skills are developed through thinking skills. The subject is popular and the children are eager to learn more. The pupils have high expectations of their work and make good progress in information gathering, skills and understanding. Their performance in the subject is as good as in any other field.

What aspects will be addressed in the next two years?

Look at/look out for further training on teaching RE from the Church syllabus, especially with the advent of the Foundation Phase.

Question 3 : How well do learning experiences meet the needs and interests of learners and the wider community?
