It is felt that the school also makes every effort to ensure gender and racial equality. The school is starting to promote pupils awareness of multi-cultural aspects and is focussing on sustainable development and global citizenship as well as entrepreunership and comprehension of the world of work.

What aspects will the school address over the coming year?

During the coming year, the school wishes to further develop the child's role in his/her learning. Through the Curriculum 2008 thinking skills feature, the school wishes to develop problem-solving and decision making. We would also like to enhance extra-curricular activities.
