Grade 2: Good features with no important shortcomings

- 94. The spiritual development of pupils is well promoted. Collective acts of worship are provided that comply with the requirements. Local ministers and representatives from the local Theological College are invited to the school regularly to lead collective worship and these individuals offer a good contribution to the spiritual development of the pupils. Opportunities are given to the pupils to meditate quietly and to contribute confidently to the collective worship sessions, for example, by reading their own prayers and sharing experiences.
- 95. The school provides numerous opportunities to promote the moral development of pupils, and this aspect penetrates through all aspects of school life. This is done very successfully by cultivating awareness in pupils of what is acceptable and unacceptable, and by promoting firm values, emphasising respect, honesty and courtesy towards others. This, as well as the civilised ethos within the school, is an outstanding feature of the provision.
