Grade 1: Good with outstanding features

113. There is a very good range of educational visits, for example to theatres, power stations, churches and chapels, to name but a few, and visitors to the school from the community give a useful insight into their life and work. The school takes every opportunity to capitalise on its links with the community to extend the learning experiences it offers pupils. This has a positive impact on curricular activities.

114. The provision for pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development is good. Relationships within the school are very positive and pupils across the school are polite, courteous and demonstrate respect for each other, adults and visitors. Acts of collective worship fulfil statutory requirements and offer opportunities for whole school reflection. Also, members of the clergy attend regularly to lead acts of collective worship. Moral messages are conveyed regularly throughout the school day.

115. The day-to-day life of the school effectively promotes pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. The provision for pupils' personal and social education is good. The requirements of PSE are carefully planned across the schools" schemes of work and classroom activities such as circle time serve to encourage pupils to share emotional experiences related to different feelings, whilst listening respectfully to the views of others. Also, pupils are aware of the importance of a healthy lifestyle and of healthy eating and the School Council has established clubs such as fitness clubs and a school fruit shop as part of the Healthy Schools project.
