Good features

- 207. All key stage 1 pupils made up prayers of thanksgiving to a good standard after discussing how Christians pray.
- 208. After a visit to the local church, almost all key stage 1 pupils have a good knowledge of the purpose of a church, and its main features.
- 209. All pupils in key stage 1 can discuss the notion of family and a mother s care well. They offer their ideas about what a mother s love means and its impact on them to a good standard.
- 210. Pupils in Y2 show good understanding of the features of the Hindu religion by discussing the story of Rama and Sita.
- 211. All key stage 1 pupils know that Jesus Christ is important to the Christian.
- 212. Pupils in key stage 2 consider abstract questions and concepts such as, "Is there such a thing as peace?" well. They link their ideas with their experiences, with Christian tradition, the life of Jesus Christ and also with their learning about the traditions of Judaism.
- 213. All pupils in key stage 2 reflect upon, and explore their ideas about Christianity well as they discuss specific symbols and artefacts.
- 214. Pupils in key stage 2 discuss well how God supports the life of believers and suggest ideas with which they can relate about how this happens.
