1. <u>APPLICATION RECEIVED</u>

- **1.1** An application is appended to vary the premises licence of Bryn Teg Holiday Park Llanrug, Caernarfon, LL55 4RF from Park Holidays Ltd., Bexhill-on-Sea. The application seeks permission to amend the location plan of the licensed bar area of y Lolfa and the eating area only. In addition, permission is sought to add the licensable activities of Plays, Boxing and Wrestling, and indoor dance performances only Monday to Sunday 09:00 in the morning until midnight; on to the licence.
- **1.2** It was confirmed that every other part of the outlined plan for the licensed area remains the same, and that the licensed activities and hours on the current licence will remain the same. Also a request has been made to change a condition on the licence in the context of the changes to the outlined plans.
- **1.3** The applicant is not proposing any additional measures to those on the operational schedule of the current licence, in order to promote the licensing objectives.
- **1.4** There is no change to the licensed activities hours, nor to the conditions in the operating schedule.
- **1.5** The officers of the Licensing Authority are satisfied that there is sufficient evidence that the application has been submitted in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and the relevant regulations, and is therefore valid.
- **1.6** Several objections have been received from nearby residents; further details of which are contained in the report.

Customers are not allowed to take from the bars open containers such as glasses and open bottles outside the licenced areas as shown on the layout plans attached to this Premises Licence'

2. <u>Measures recommended by the applicant to promote the licensing objectives</u>

- **2.1** The measures recommended by the applicant are identical to the current licence, except for the additional condition recommended, see the above table.
- **2.2** Full details of the promotion measures in relation to the licensing objectives can be found in the operating schedule of the current licence in the appendix to the report.

3. CONSULTATION

3.1 The application was consulted upon and the following responses were received -

3.2 Neighbouring residents - The objections to the application were mainly based on the licensing objective of preventing public nuisance , but also some other matters had been raised that were relevant to the licensing objective of ensuring public safety

- **3.3** Every objection received by local residents, note experiences of disruption due to noise from the holiday park over the past few years. Various residents noted that the noise had been bad enough and was happening regularly enough that they had to complain on a number of occasions to the local councillor, and to the Council. Some residents noted that the problems had worsened over the past few years under the recent owners; and there was an allegation from one respondent that noise had even originated from activities at Bryn Teg Park when strict measures under Covid Restrictions remained in place.
- **3.4** It was noted in some of the responses that there were occasions when doors and windows were not being closed during entertainment inside the building; and as a result that noise could be heard clearly and loudly in dwellings outside the park.
- **3.5** A number of respondents noted that they had complained directly to Bryn Teg managers, but that this had not led to any improvement in the noise nuisance at all.
- **3.6** Some of the respondents noted that they work shifts, or work from home, and the noise nuisance therefore creates problems during the day and the evening.
- **3.7** It can be seen that a number of respondents had noted that glass bottles were being emptied into recycling containers outside late at night after licensed activities has come to an end. This was despite the fact that there was a condition on the property's current operating schedule noting that this was not meant to happen *'The work of clearing rubbish such as bottles and placing them in containers outside the bar areas will take place when it would minimise disruption as much as possible on the park residents'.*
- **3.8 Public Safety concerns -** One responder was of the opinion that the bar area was very small for the number of intended customers; and a number of respondents noted that the road to the entrance of Bryn Teg was narrow, busy and dangerous.
- **3.9 Local Member and Community Council Concerns** The Community Council Clerk noted that there was a high number of calls from residents objecting to the application due to concerns regarding the continuation and increase in noise nuisance from current and proposed licensed activities at Bryn Teg Park. An extraordinary meeting of the Council was arranged to discuss the concerns. On the basis of these concerns, the Community Councillors came to the conclusion that the application had to be opposed on the basis that the noise problems from Bryn Teg were likely to worsen with additional activities such as showing wrestling and boxing as such sport supporters tend to be noisy. It was understood that the Park managers had met with members of the Community Council and some residents; and that the residents were not convinced with the promises made.
- **3.10** The Local councillor acknowledges that the company was an important employer in the area; and contributes to the area's economy. Despite this, he noted that he had received various complaints regarding noise nuisance since he was elected as councillor in 2017; and that the complaints increase during the summer weeks when the doors and windows were open.
- **3.11** It is noted that the Councillor is making a valid point that 300 caravans are located on Bryn Teg Holiday Park; and although it is a rural location; that a variety of dwellings were located on the outskirts of the park.
- **3.12** Furthermore, the Councillor noted that he had brought the noise nuisance problems to the attention of the council's Public Protection Officers; and that he was aware that the officers

had discussed the noise problems with the managers of the park; and although the officers gave advice on noise reduction, there had been no improvement in the situation.

- **3.13** The councillor recommends that the decision on the application is postponed until the owners and the Park managers put effective noise control and mitigation measures in place for the current licensed activities that are held on the site.
- **3.14 Observations of Public Protection Officers -** officers had confirmed that noise complaints had been received from local residents regarding licensed activities at the Holiday Park, and that an effort had been made to get the Park managers to mitigate the noise.
- **3.15** Confirmation was also received that lawyers on behalf of the owners had contacted the Public Protection Officers to present a draft application for observations. The draft application was regarding the additional licensed activities indoors and outdoors. The applicant's legal representative agreed to present an application for additional licensed activities indoors only as the officer had declared that noise complaints had been received following a recent Temporary Event Notice application for an outdoor broadcast of a film. Furthermore, the officer confirmed that noise complaints were being received for licensed activities on the park under the current licence.

4.0 Conclusions and Recommendations

- **4.1** The applicant had attempted to some extent to identify that there were noise problems; by contacting the Public Protection Officers for observations on a draft application to vary the premises licence.
- **4.2** An opportunity however had been lost to identify and fully get to grips with the noise problems. Although the application presented is only asking for additional licensable activities on the same hours as the current licence, indoors only; the applicant has not offered to restrict the licensed entertainment activities of the current licence to be indoors only.
- **4.3** In addition, the applicant has failed to identify that more effective measures needed to be included to control noise in the operating schedule and had not proposed improvements or further measures. Note, from the operating schedule of the current licence seen in the appendix to the report; that only the following clause proposed as a measure to ensure there was no public nuisance '*The location of this property is in such a remote area that it would not cause nuisance to any person residing in the vicinity. 'The work of clearing rubbish such as bottles and placing them in containers outside the bar areas will take place at times when it would minimise disruption as much as possible on the park residents.*
- **4.4** This clause in the operating schedule was wrong in its assessment that the licensable activities were not going to create nuisance as the location was in a remote area. Various residential properties are located close to the park. In addition, respondents to this application had testified that not one of the noise conditions in the schedule was being implemented; with many complaining that bottles were being emptied into external containers late at night.

5. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that this Committee refuse the application on the basis of the evidence presented; unless the applicant can propose noise control measures in the operating schedule, and restrict the licensable activities to indoors only.

1. <u>APPLICATION RECEIVED</u>

1. An application is appended to Vary the Premises Licence for New Horizons, Sunnysands Caravan Park, Tal Y Bont, Gwynedd LL43 2LQ. The application is made in relation to extend the Alcohol, Live and Recorded Music Hours.

2. The current licence only allows all above Licensable Activities until 11pm Sunday-Saturday.

- 3. The applicant proposes amended conditions as follows -
- Extend Alcohol Hours and Recorded Music (Indoors) from 11pm to 2am.
- Extend Live Music (Indoors) hours from 11pm to 12am.
- Provide daily Entertainment and Activities for the Caravan Owners and Holiday Makers in order to offer a Late Night Venue.

5. It is noted on the application, shown in the appendix, that the applicant has stated that Live and Recorded music will only take place indoors.

6. The officers of the Licensing Authority are satisfied that there is sufficient evidence that the application has been submitted in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and the relevant regulations, therefore is valid.

7. An objection has been received from a nearby resident; there are further details in the report.

8. Comments from the Police have been received; further details in the report.

2. <u>Measures recommended by the applicant to promote the licensing objectives</u>

- **2.1** The applicant included additional measures, as seen in part M of the application in the appendix to this report on how the Four Licensing objectives will be promoted such as
 - Keeping doors and Windows shut during entertainment
 - All entrances have an effective lobby to minimise the breakout of noise.
 - Ensure there is no underage drinking, drugs or violent behaviour.
 - Ensure risk assessment are regularly reviewed.
 - Security team will be registered S.I.A.
 - CCTV will be in operation at all times.
- **2.2** Full details of the control measures in relation to the Licensing objectives can be found in the operating schedule for the current licence as well as in the application in the appendix to the report.

3.2 <u>Neighbouring resident</u>

A letter of objection was received from a Local resident who lives at the top of the lane before the Railway bridge near the site. It is noted that all traffic and pedestrians from the Premises pass in close proximity to her property. The Local resident is concerned that there will be an increase in noise form the site and due to loud intoxicated customers leaving the site late at night.

Furthermore, she noted that the site has always been a Family Holiday Park with an alcohol limit to accomodate families and extending the hours will change the dynamics of the site. The representation can be read in full in the appendix to this report.

3.3 North Wales Police

There was no evidence from the Police to object to the application; furthermore, the Police met up with the Site General Manager to consider recommendations to include CCTV conditions and Challenge 25 Policy, and it was confirmed the refusal and drug records logs will be used. It was also noted that no children were to be permitted on the Premises beyond 23:00hrs.

4. <u>UPDATE</u>

1. Further to the meeting; the applicant confirmed by e mail that all Police recommendations would be included in the new licence's operating schedule, should it be granted by committee.(see e-mail attached).

5 RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that this Committee considers the objection , and **approves** the application in accordance with the recommendations of the Police, and requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.
