The Test of Soundness that the Inspector will consider are as follows:-

Test 1: Does the plan conform? (i.e. is it obvious that the LDP corresponds

with other plans?)

Questions

- Does it consider national policy and the Wales Spatial Plan?
- Does it consider Welfare Objectives 18?
- Does it consider the Welsh National Marine Plan?
- Is it consistent with local plans, strategies and facility programmes?
- Does it correspond with the plans of nearby authorities?
- Does it reflect the Single Integrated Plan or the National Park Management Plan?

Test 2: Is the plan suitable? (i.e. is the plan suitable for the area in light of the

evidence?)

Questions

- Does it specifically involve the local area?
- Does it involve the key matters?
- •Is it supported by robust, well-proportioned and believable evidence?
- •Is it possible to indicate the rational basis to the plan's policies?

• Does it seek to meet the needs assessed and does it contribute to ensuring sustainable development?

•Are the vision and the strategy positive and aspirational enough?

- •Have the 'actual' alternative options been suitably considered?
- •Is it rational, reasonable and balanced?
- Is it coordinating and consistent?
- •Is it clear and specific?

Appendix Ch Tests of Soundness

Test 3: Will the test deliver (i.e. is it likely to be effective?)

Questions

•Will it be effective?

•Can it be implemented?

•Is assistance available from the relevant infrastructure providers, in terms of providing funding and completing developments within relevant time limits?

•Will developments be viable?

- Is it possible to provide the allocated sites?
- Is the plan flexible enough? Are there suitable reserve provisions?
- •Is it effectively monitored?'
