Dear Councillor Jones,

Firstly, we would like to acknowledge and thank the Council for their kind words about the Charity. Collectively, over the past twenty-one years our supporters, volunteers, medics, pilots, allocators, Charity employees and Trustees have helped to grow Wales Air Ambulance into the service that it is today. We will forever be grateful for that.

We would also like to thank Councillor Dyfrig Siencyn, Councillor Dilwyn Morgan and Councillor Llio Elenid Owen for taking their valuable time to meet with the Charity's Chief Executive, Dr Sue Barnes, and Director of Strategic Communications and Engagement, Steven Stokes, recently. This presented an important opportunity to discuss the complexities around the proposal and the scrutiny/engagement process, as well as listen to the questions that are being asked by communities across Gwynedd.


With regards to the service reconfiguration proposals, in-depth research and analysis has been conducted by our NHS medical partners, the Emergency Medical Retrieval and Transfer Service (EMRTS), which includes independent modelling. The resulting EMRTS Service Development Proposal has been presented to both Charity Trustees and the NHS Wales Emergency Ambulance Services Committee (which is made up of the Chief Executives of every Welsh health board and the Chief Executive of the Welsh Ambulance Service).

In summary, the proposal indicates that through a reconfiguration of the air ambulance service (revision of base locations, a change in operational hours, an enhancement of after-dark flying), Wales Air Ambulance could attend hundreds more life or limb-threatening emergencies every year and every county of Wales, including Gwynedd, would see an increase in the number of critically ill patients attended.
