1. Background

The purpose of this report is to present information to the Committee regarding formal complaints made against members. The report is based on information received from the Ombudsman and the case references are his. The Committee will also be up-dated in relation to the direction of the Committee relating to the training of Cllr Christopher O'Neal on the 14th of July 2014.

2. Complaints

2.1 Case No. 6141/201400682

Date received: 29/04/14

Complaint

Complaint by fellow member that a town councillor had misused his position for financial gain and had taken part in a discussion on a matter in which he had a prejudicial interest.

Decision

Ombudsman investigating.

2.2 Case No. 5847/201404989 & 5847/201404990

Date received: 21/10/14

Complaint

That a town council member had behaved in a manner that would bring the council into disrepute.

Decision

Ombudsman investigating.

2.3 Case No. 201403463

Date received: 18/07/14

Complaint

Complaint that a town councillor had taken part in a discussion on a mater in which she had a prejudicial interest.

Decision

No further steps to be taken. Although there was evidence to suggest that a breach of the code had taken place, the Ombudsman was not persuaded that the Standards Committee would impose a sanction in the circumstances.

2.4 Case No. 201402810

Date received: 28/07/14

Complaint

Member had sent an e-mail to a local organisation, purporting to express the community council's views, without its authorisation.

Decision

Standards Committee concluded that there had been a breach of the cod and imposed a censure.

3. Cllr. Christopher O' Neal

The Committee will recall that following its decision to suspend the Cllr in July 2014 that it directed that he should attend a training session with the Monitoring Officer on "The Code of Conduct and all protocols which are relevant to the Councillors conduct"

Following completion of his suspension steps have been taken to arrange a training session with the Councillor. Up to now it has not been possible to arrange the training. Despite agreeing three dates and times with the Councillor in March April and May he has not attended any. I will be giving further advice to the committee on this matter at the meeting. I have informed the Councillor that I will be reporting on the matter to the Committee.

4. The Ombudsman's Casebook
